## ***Saturday, September 6, 2008:***

- **8 a.m. - 12 p.m. : Work party to help maintain the PCT !**  
Volunteers meet at the PCT Pub and Hostel, located at 500 WaNaPa St. in the center of Cascade Locks. Please wear sturdy shoes, pants, and bring water and a lunch. Gloves and tools are provided.
- **1 p.m. : Let's go for a 6-mile day hike along the PCT !**  
Hikers meet at the PCT Pub and Hostel, located at 500 WaNaPa St. in the center of Cascade Locks, (on-street parking is available.) This section of trail offers views of beautiful forests and waterfalls. We will be shuttled to the Herman Creek trailhead and follow the PCT to Cascade Locks.
- **5 p.m. - 7:45 p.m. : Food & Refreshments, Raffles & Presentations !**  
Come to the pavilion area, in the marine park of Cascade Locks for locally-prepared food, refreshments, prizes, and for relaxation along the Columbia River. Events include a PCT trivia game, gear demonstrations, and plenty of PCT information and goodies provided by the PCTA. Also, there will two raffles: one for outdoor gear and one for a photography workshop/tour by bicycle, provided by Portland Bicycle Tours and Jason Waicunas Photography!
